Remembrance November 2024

Also in 2024 we organized the yearly remembrance, on Saturday, November 30th. Children's Mayor Maren Mourik, Mayor T. Segers and pastor of the army Nederveen from Nieuw-Lekkerland held a short speech / meditation. Also students from the School with the Bible from Streefkerk provided a contribution. They were given a certificate, which said that they will take care of the monument. The presence of the re-enactment group gave the remembrance a fitting military presentation. Besides that, there were several military vehicles to admire of the 'The Green Virus' Foundation. School-children and guests were brought to the monument with army trucks and also other children were allowed to take a seat in these vehicles to take a photo. The Ensemble of Royal Apollo played along the event with music.

The two minutes silence to remember, hoisting the flags and playing the National Anthems, where veterans gave a military salute, were impressive moments for all people present. Finally, various wreaths were laid at the memorial with the re-enactors and children were asked to lay a white gillyflower.





In Memoriam

On January 1st, 2025, eyewitness Mr. A den Ouden passed away at the age of 90 years.

Mr. den Ouden told us on September 29th, 2018, during the official morning program of the unveiling of the memorial, about his recollection of the shooting of the B17 bomber by German fighters. Mr. den Ouden also laid a wreath, with his wife (and local children)on May 4th, 2022 at the monument. We wish the relatives a lot of strength to live with this loss.



Involvement schools

There is a structural contact with the School with the Bible from Streefkerk. Every year there will be held a presentation in group 8 and some students of that Group give a contribution during the annual remembrance. To ask structurally at other schools in Molenlanden / Nieuw-Lekkerland, attention about World War 2 and local history of the Mission Belle, we are connected with the Learning Line Heritage of County Molenlanden. We told you about this in the newsletter of April last year. Meanwhile there is a concept lesson that will be made definitive in the first quarter of 2025. The starting point will be that the lessons will be given by teachers or guest lecturers. This in preference with a visit to the monument.
