Continued attention for the monument

To give the Mission Belle Memorial a lasting place in the memory of everybody, we of the Foundation have decided to join the yearly May 4th and 5th memorials.

Newsletter

On May 4th the Dutch and American flag will fly halfmast and on May 5th the flags will be used by our national rules. There will also be flagging on the last Monday in May, which will be this year on May 27th.

On that day it will be Memorial Day in America, so we will show sympathy for our liberators.

On the last Saturday in November or the first Saturday in December we organize a short public ceremony at the monument, to remember the crash of the Mission Belle on December 1th, 1943.

For 2019 is chosen for Saturday November 30th. If possible, the local schools will be included in this event.

Visitors from near and far

We are glad with the visitors, who are regularly seen at the monument. It is striking if you see their attention for the beautiful design of it.

Considerable is the number of visitors of our website: the counter is going to 8,000, an average of 16 per day.

Our member John Heuvelman is keeping regularly friendly contacts with the next of kin of the crew of the Mission Belle. Through our website well keep them up-to-date with information about the monument on the dike near the Lek river.

A very special visitor came to the monument last March 28^{th,} when Jim Keeffe III with wife and daughter and their guest-family from Papendrecht, Sjaak and Pleunie Korteland where here. Jim is the son of the American pilot James Keeffe, who jumped from his plane on March 8th, 1944, above the Westeind near Papendrecht and was hidden by the Korteland family. During the first part of his escape he was helped by Marinus Veth and Johannes Verdoorn. Thanks to them he managed to reach, via Dordrecht, Rotterdam and could stay out of the hands of the Germans for 5 months. After this, he wanted to get back to England, via Belgium, but by betrayal he got trapped in Antwerp. Just like the crew of the Mission Belle, he survived the war in a Stalag-Luft P.O.W. camp. There are still close contacts between the Keeffe and Korteland families. Jim gave a impressive presentation for a sold-out hall on March 27th, 2019 in Papendrecht about the adventures of his father. The next day, John Heuvelman gave them at the B-17G-Memorial, an explanation about the crash, the salvation of the survivors and the salvage of the victims. On behalf of the Mission Belle Foundation, Kees Stam gave to the Keeffe family our book with the phrase 'We knew it would be a long day'.
