Give the future a past

On May 27th, the day people in America remember all victims of war: Memorial Day. Again the showing of flags. Lying of the wreath was done, in the presence of some Board members, by former Board member Theo Jansen. Our own flag poles proved to be of good service at remembrances and celebrations.

Eye-witness Pleun de Groot passed away

On April 4^{th,} 2021, Pleun de Groot passed away at the age of 86 years. He was eye-witness of the fight in the air and the emergency landing of the Mission Belle on December 1st, 1943. He was from the beginning very emotionally connected with the realization of the Mission Belle Memorial. During the unveiling on September 29th, 2018, he made all the people present, including the 36 American guests, part of the traumas of that day. May he rest in peace.

The official remembrance of the emergency landing of the Mission Belle is for 2021 planned on Saturday November 27th, the Saturday closest to December 1st. Depending the Corona rules of that period, we as Board hope to get a ceremony with dignity. We hope to welcome everybody again. Attention for durability



Within the Board we have thought about the theme of durability, related to the monument. With three granite columns and a RVS plane model, there is of course a durable construction. The maintenance of the street furniture and the flag poles is organized in a way that damage to the environment can't happen. The flag poles, the monument and the street furniture will be taken care of twice a year, as a mark of appreciation by Robbie van der Veen of Glas Washing and Total Cleaning Schoonmaak, cleaned with distilled water. Weeds will be removed by hand as often as possible.

Other monuments in the Alblasserwaard region



In this, and following newsletters we will also pay some attention to other monuments in the Alblasserwaard region. First the het monument for the crashed Hawker Typhoon in Alblasserdam and the pilot who got killed. It's a tribute to the Belgian R.A.F. pilot Jean-Noël Vandaele. He got killed on September 28th, 1944 in the Korteland polder.

The monument is placed at the Kortelandsche Kade, close to the crash location in Alblasserdam.
